Astrosis: union with The Cosmos during one's lifetime, either intellectually, spiritually and/or physically.

Cosmosis: union with The Cosmos in death, interpreted as either a physical and spiritual phenomenon namely as an intermediate, post-corporeal state, or as only a physical, corporeal phenomenon.

Transtellationism: one of two astroeschatological schools of thought affirming supernaturalism and the possibility for a post-corporeal astrosis.

Astronaturalism: one of two astroeschatological schools affirming naturalism with an emphasis placed on corporeal cosmosis and one's contribution to transcension.

Recosmism: the belief in the rebirth of all sapient beings who failed to achieve astrosis during their previous lifetime.

Astronality: a person's emotional and existential connection to the astronomical world, regarded as an unmerited conferment bestowed during the scope of man as a result of humanity's preferment.

Scope: the opportunity of the present moment to attain astrosis and to contribute to the endeavour of transcension, regarded as an unmerited conferment bestowed during the Enkindlement as the first intentional engagement with astronality.

Stellancy: one's degree of physical, intellectual or spiritual proximity to the astronomical world, regarded as a merited conferment that is cultivated through the actioning of scope and one's engagement with astronality.

Postastrosis: the opportunity for the soul to achieve astrosis after the death of its bodily host, regarded, in transtellationist belief, as the pinnacle of the Seven Steps of Cosmosis
